Brockton - The Brockton Youth Foundation has named **Harry Allen** of Brewster – former Principal, Brockton High School, and 1st Director of Brockton Community Schools (1970); **Brockton Youth Soccer Association** and its Executive Board – **Rick & Anne Savignano, Greg Joyce, Michael Khang, Joe Lupica, Jen Marchetti, Lisa O'Donnell, Eileen Searles, and Juan Aguilar, all of Brockton; Elizabeth Chauppetta** and **John Fontes** of Brockton and **Kristin Schilling** of Hanover – Brockton High School students who raised money for Muscular Dystrophy with a cross country bike ride; **Tony DeGrace** of Brockton – Brockton Fire Department, youth coach and adjustment counselor at the "Y"; **Kathy Smith** of Brockton – Director of Brockton Community Schools, BPS; and **George Sylvester** of West Bridgewater – long time youth basketball coach, as honorees for its 3rd annual **Breakfast with Champions** event on Sunday, March 20, 2011 at 10:30 a.m. at the Shaw's Center, One Lexington Way, Brockton, MA. The event will include a special ceremony to highlight their extraordinary leadership to support Brockton youth.

Mr. Allen was named the first Director of Brockton Community Schools in 1970 with the opening of the new Brockton High School and developed nationally recognized programs to serve the Brockton community. The Brockton Youth Soccer Association is celebrating it's 30th anniversary this year and serves over 1,000 Brockton youth. Several executive board members have 20 or more year of service. Ms Chauppetta, Ms Schilling and Mr. Fontes received national press last summer during their bike ride from California to Massachusetts to raise funds for Duchene's, a form of Muscular Dystrophy. Mr. DeGrace is a firefighter with Brockton Fire Department and continues to find time to coach youth sports and work as a youth adjustment counselor with the Old Colony YMCA. Ms Smith became the Director of Brockton Community Schools in 2001, oversees 45 programs including Start Smart Extended Day programs, adult enrichment and recreation programs, adult high school diploma program, Expressway to English (ESOL), and the Get Ready summer programs, all of which serve over 10,000 youth and adults annually. Mr. Sylvester began coaching his son's basketball team in 1995 and has continued as one on the longest serving coaches for Brockton Community Basketball and currently serves as the coach for the West Bridgewater Middle School boys basketball team.

The **Brockton Youth Foundation** is a $501 \otimes (3)$ charitable organization formed by involved parents and civic leaders to provide funding, leadership and programs to support out-of-school activities as well as increased access and lower fees for all programs serving Brockton youth.
