Teen Healthy Relationship Peer Leader Job Description

POSITION SUMMARY:

The Teen Healthy Relationship Peer Leader will work within a cohort of 5 students who through education, specialized training, and community support, strive to teach other teens and community members about the dangers of dating violence and abuse, developing healthy peer and adult relationships, and establishing healthy habits to promote overall well being. The Peer Leaders will create activities, social media accounts, and use other influential social methods to spread awareness and establish connections among community groups in the Brockton area.

WEEKLY COMMITMENT

- The time commitment of this position is 5 hours a week, with meetings on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5pm to 7pm, plus one hour of virtual at home training.
- This position is paid at a rate of up to \$12.00/hr

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- Assist in the design and delivery of programs, activities, field trips and events which support the establishment and maintenance of healthy peer and adult relationships, as directed.
- Relate to peers with respect and understanding, and act as a role model at all times.
- Adhere to the program's policies as designed and agreed upon by the peer leaders and the program coordinator
- Provide instruction and leadership in a variety of activities with enthusiasm and creativity.
- Attend and complete the six week Safe Dates curriculum training
- Adhere to and uphold all cohort rules and policies as designed and agreed upon by the peer leaders and the program coordinator

- Support efforts to recruit peers to participate in healthy relationships programming.
